FUNDING FOR ACTIVE TRAVEL IN THE WORKPLACE

WHAT IS IT?

This Paths For all administered funding is for projects that help cut Scotland's carbon emissions, improve air quality, help reverse the trend towards sedentary lifestyles and tackle health inequalities. In 20/21 it will also aim to support projects that are looking to enable more working from home, Grants available are between £5000 and £50,000 and need to be match funded.

HOW DO I APPLY?

If your project fits the bill, you must first register an expression of interest.

You will then be contacted to discuss if and how to take your application further.

E-BIKE GRANT FUND

energy saving trust

WHAT IS IT?

This fund, supported by Transport Scotland, is open for applications from local authorities, public sector agencies and higher education institutions.

There are two categories:

A - Up to £25,000 for projects that will provide the chance for communities to trial e-bikes

B - Up to £200,000 for large scale fleets of pool bikes for public share schemes etc

E-BIKE BUSINESS LOAN

WHAT IS IT?

An interest free loan of up to £30,000. These loans are to support organisations who wish to reduce their carbon footprint by using active travel in place of their current transport systems. The loan covers:

- New pedal-assisted electric bikes, up to £3,000 per bike
- new cargo or ecargo bikes, up to £6,000 per bike
- new adaptive bikes or electric adaptive bikes



HOW DO I APPLY?

To apply for a loan, call The Energy Saving Trust on 0800 0931 669 and speak to a Sustainable Transport Coordinator and check out the Energy Saving Trust website for more details

WHICH BIKES SHOULD I BUY?

to buy a variety of sizes
to meet the needs of
your employees. Step
through bikes allow ease
getting on and off bikes.
Mudguards and pannier
racks are essential.

WHERE TO STORE THE BIKES?

You will need a room on the ground floor or with ramp access to use as a pool bike room or you can purchase bike nests to securely keep your pool bikes somewhere safe outside your workplace.

Lockers and showers are often required

WHAT OTHER EQUIPMENT IS NEEDED?

Helmets, high visibility
jackets are very
important for safety
whilst on the bike.
Panniers and basic bike
maintenance equipment
is also needed such as
pumps and puncture
repair tools

DO I NEED INSURANCE?

Often an organisations public liability insurance protects against third party claims for injury or damage to other persons or property. Insurance to protect bicycles from theft may also need to be considered
